OBERAMMERGAU 2010

At the beginning of June, after 4 very wet days in Berchtesgaden, near the German/Austrian border, we were relieved to reach Oberammergau in bright sunshine. We were looking forward to fulfilling a lifelong desire – to see the world famous Passion Play performed by the inhabitants of this beautiful mountain village in Southern Bavaria. The population of Oberammergau is 5000, and approximately 2,500 are involved in the production – on stage or behind it. Many also open their homes to offer dinner, bed and breakfast to visitors, while other guests stay in local hotels. We were fortunate to stay for 2 nights in the hotel of the current playwright, Herr Otto Huber.

Back in 1633, as the Black Death raged through this part of Germany claiming many lives, the people of Oberammergau vowed to re-enact the “Passion Death and Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ” every 10 years. From that moment on not one person succumbed to the plague, and the first performance took place in 1634. Initially, the play was acted on a special stage which was erected over the graves of the plague victims, but in response to its popularity and fame, a large theatre was built in the 19th century to house an audience of 5000 people. This theatre has a covered auditorium, but the stage is open, with majestic views of wooded mountains rising into the sky. Over the years the original German script for the play has been revised, and we were given an English transcript which we were able to follow. Stirring music with orchestra and choir and soloists add to this unique presentation. It is acted on 5 days each week from mid May to early October, 102 performances in all this year. Each lasts for nearly 6 hours, with a 3 hour supper break between the 2 main parts of the play.

We were intrigued to see lots of men with very long hair and beards cycling around the village! This is because the men who are chosen to take lead parts in the play are forbidden to cut their hair or shave from Ash Wednesday in the previous year – 15 months growth! There are 2 casts for all the main players, who take part in alternate performances. The crowd scenes give the village children the opportunity to be involved, together with sheep, goats, doves, and the donkey on which Jesus rode into

Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, which heralds the opening of the play. This year 2 camels also appeared which came as rather as a surprise!

It is hard to pinpoint highlights in a performance of such excellence. However, on reflection, it had to be the crucifixion of Jesus which was shown in all its starkness and suffering but with great sensitivity. Although thunder and lightning effects are created at the appropriate time, it was almost beyond belief that during the trials of Jesus and His crucifixion we experienced an actual thunderstorm with sheet and fork lightning. It could not have been more dramatic. The finale was deeply moving too. Mary Magdalene spoke the last few words in triumph and with great passion:

“I know that my saviour lives! He is with us all the days until the end of the world! Therefore my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices! Oh, could I proclaim it throughout all the worlds, so that the mountains and cliffs and heaven and earth should re-echo with the words: “Hallelujah! He is risen!”

This was indeed a unique occasion for us – not a theatrical performance in the normal sense, but a deep spiritual experience as we witnessed again “the greatest story ever told.” It is good to remember that it isn’t just a story, but an event of history that changed the world, and can still transform individual lives today.

Rose's Ramblings

Sri Lanka – a year on.

Many of you know that I go frequently to Sri Lanka, indeed this will be my seventh trip since the tsunami. It will be interesting to see how things have progressed in this war-torn land.

I usually work with the NCPA – which is the national body for working with the most vulnerable children. With them I have worked in the war zones to help children find peace and hope for the future, and rehabilitate them from fear into optimism. I've also worked in Certified Schools, where abused children are locked in their classrooms to stop the running away. This tells you all you need to know about the climate they live in – where an abusive home is preferable to the residential home they now have. This was a deeply challenging place to work; some of the girls were chatty and enjoyed games etc; others were so deeply depressed that they could not join in anything but sat staring with deep dark eyes full of despair from the edge, where they could not escape as we were all locked in.

Having worked even in the prisons too for many years, including running workshops with those on death row, I cannot say how awful this school was, and how heartbreaking. These are the forgotten ones. As abuse is 'normal' compared with war or tsunami, all the aid effort and attention goes into the dramatic, media-friendly places. Yet these girls live their lives in the darkness, unnoticed and forgotten by the world, with no international attention and little local thought. I thank God for allowing me to work in these hidden places, and as I return to Sri Lanka this year I would ask for prayer to guide where I go this time – into which hell-hole. I pray that the little light that I bring – with laughter, love and hope, can bring a lasting joy.

I have had the bitter-sweet experience of seeing children cry and beg me not to leave at the end of a fun-filled day, and it makes me wonder if it

is better they don't experience what could be, rather than know the pain of its loss.

I will be travelling on July 8th – God and volcano permitting! – returning mid August. Please do pray for safety and wisdom, and open doors for this work. The politics are heavy, with journalists threatened and murdered if they tell the truth, and government opposition arrested. I said a few years ago that Sri Lanka was travelling on a path similar to Zimbabwe and was castigated for it by a few people; yet I stand by this. There may not be the starvation of the African neighbour, but the fear of stepping out of line politically extends to everyone. Huge posters of the President announcing him to be god are on every street corner, and last year there was a telephone hotline for people to ring to complain of any foreigners who criticised the government. Therefore – I won't be saying any political comment while in that country!! My phone is usually tapped, which makes phone calls to minority groups nerve-wracking in case you are seen to be an enemy of the state. This year it is proving nigh impossible to get a visa as every department head is changing after their recent election. When I watch political programmes here – even Question Time – I realise the crucial difference of what it means to be free – able to criticise and mock your leaders – to bring them down to size and remind them of their accountability without threat of imprisonment or murder.

Into this startlingly beautiful country with hopeful welcoming people I shall go, hopefully with God's blessing and guidance, to do what I can to bring God's love in action. Please keep me in your prayers, and if you feel called to give any donations for the work (not for me, but for the projects) any amount would be gratefully received. Each workshops cost me at least £25 in materials, and I am totally self-funded.

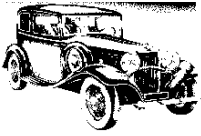

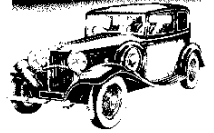

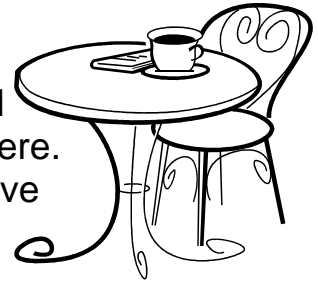

Thorpe Village Hall - Annual Report - 11 June 2010

The Management Committee has consisted of Jim Hudson, David Froggatt, Bob Evans, Barbara Wager, Cyril Challinor, Clarke Lomas and Andrew Wager during the year since the last Annual Meeting on Monday 14 May 2009. Andrew Wager has continued to act as chairman and secretary, while Bob Evans has continued as treasurer.

Management Committee meetings were held on 14 May 2009, 6 August 2009, 16 October 2009 and 30 April 2010

Gill Frith has been the caretaker since 1992. The committee remain very grateful for her work.

The change to the title to the Hall has been recorded with the Land Registry thanks to Jim Hudson's persistence. It is now in the custodianship of the Charity Commissioners. In August 2009, the owners of the workshop next to the Hall agreed to transfer the ownership of the side path, which had been incorrectly included with the workshop when they bought it. Once again Jim Hudson acted for us in the negotiations with the owners' solicitors. Thanks to Jim's work, and generous advice from Bob Evans' brother in law the transfer has been agreed, and the costs have been kept down to a £375 contribution to the owners' costs. We await completion of the transfer and the final transfer of custodianship to the Charity Commissioners.

The flat roof at the rear of the Hall has been repaired by Andrew Thorp and John Hambleton. The cost of £2200 was kindly supported by grants of £440 from Thorpe Parish Council, £800 from Derbyshire Dales District Council and £960 from the Dovedale Dash. Our thanks go to the funders and to Andrew and John for a job well done.

The electricity costs for the Hall are a substantial part of the costs so the committee worked with one of the switching services to find a cheaper quotation from an alternative supplier. When confronted with the information, the existing supplier was happy to match the reduced quotation, so we were saved the bother of changing supplier. It does pay to shop around.

In order to improve the Hall for the hard of hearing, Barbara Wager has proposed the

installation of a hearing loop. This will allow those with suitable hearing aids to hear what is going on more clearly. There will be a table microphone for meetings and a lapel mike for speakers. The Parish Council has agreed to provide 20% support of £283. An application to the District Council and the Dovedale Dash will be made for the remaining funds.

As a start on improving usage of the Hall, a website has been created which will contain relevant information about facilities, location, bookings and so on. There are a number of databases and other websites which contain references to venues from which the website can be linked. This will enable people looking for a venue to see whether the Hall is suitable. The draft site is currently being reviewed.

Dog-Fouling in the Village

Since I last wrote there have been further incidents of dog-fouling around and about the village especially in the vicinity of the The Foot gennel and Chapel Lane. This is not just a public awareness issue but also a Health & Safety issue as regards young children. Please be aware that if the problem persists, the Parish Council will be forced to call in the Environmental Health Officers and enforce fines, not something that I thought I might ever see in Tissington.

Tissington Traffic Management Plan (TMP)

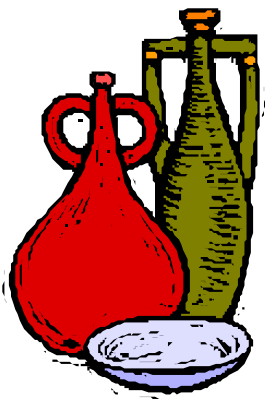

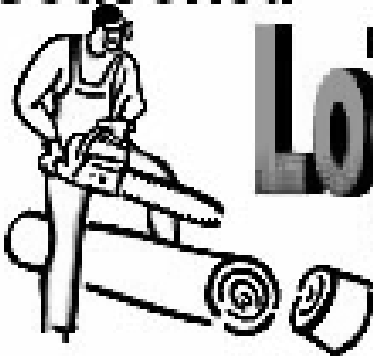
